Constance Fenimore Woolson (1840-1894)

Constance Fenimore Woolson, born in Claremont, New Hampshire, was a noted American writer of novels, short stories, and travel works. A grandniece of James Fenimore Cooper, she explored regional life, women's experiences, and post-Civil War society.
